Dear TRANSIT stakeholders.

Below are the most recent updates from our project:

- 1. These past months, our partners from the University of Zagreb were collecting the training material the rest of the partners had prepared to address at least three main target groups of the project: industry, academia, and the wider community. The establishment of the Open Edx platform (https://online.transitproject.eu/) based on this material, has enabled the development of four online interactive courses so far. In addition, three educational campaigns have been conducted, to promote broader engagement with sustainability aspects of renewable energy. Future plans include the development of at least five additional interactive courses on the Open Edx platform, and the implementation of seven additional campaigns to promote project activities. All this material will then be consolidated into a structured format, suitable for both inperson and online delivery.
- 2. TRANSIT has introduced a series of competitions, aimed at fostering innovation, sustainability, and community engagement within the realms of renewable energy. The competitions are held in Malta, United Kingdom, North Macedonia, Croatia, Spain, Montenegro, Serbia, and Cyprus, and cover three exciting categories: Best MSc Thesis in Renewable Energy & Sustainability, Industry & Trade Association Best Practices in Renewable Energy; Best Children's Drawing on Renewables. The training will cover different aspects of the process of energy transition, including not only technical challenges, but also legislative and social aspects.
